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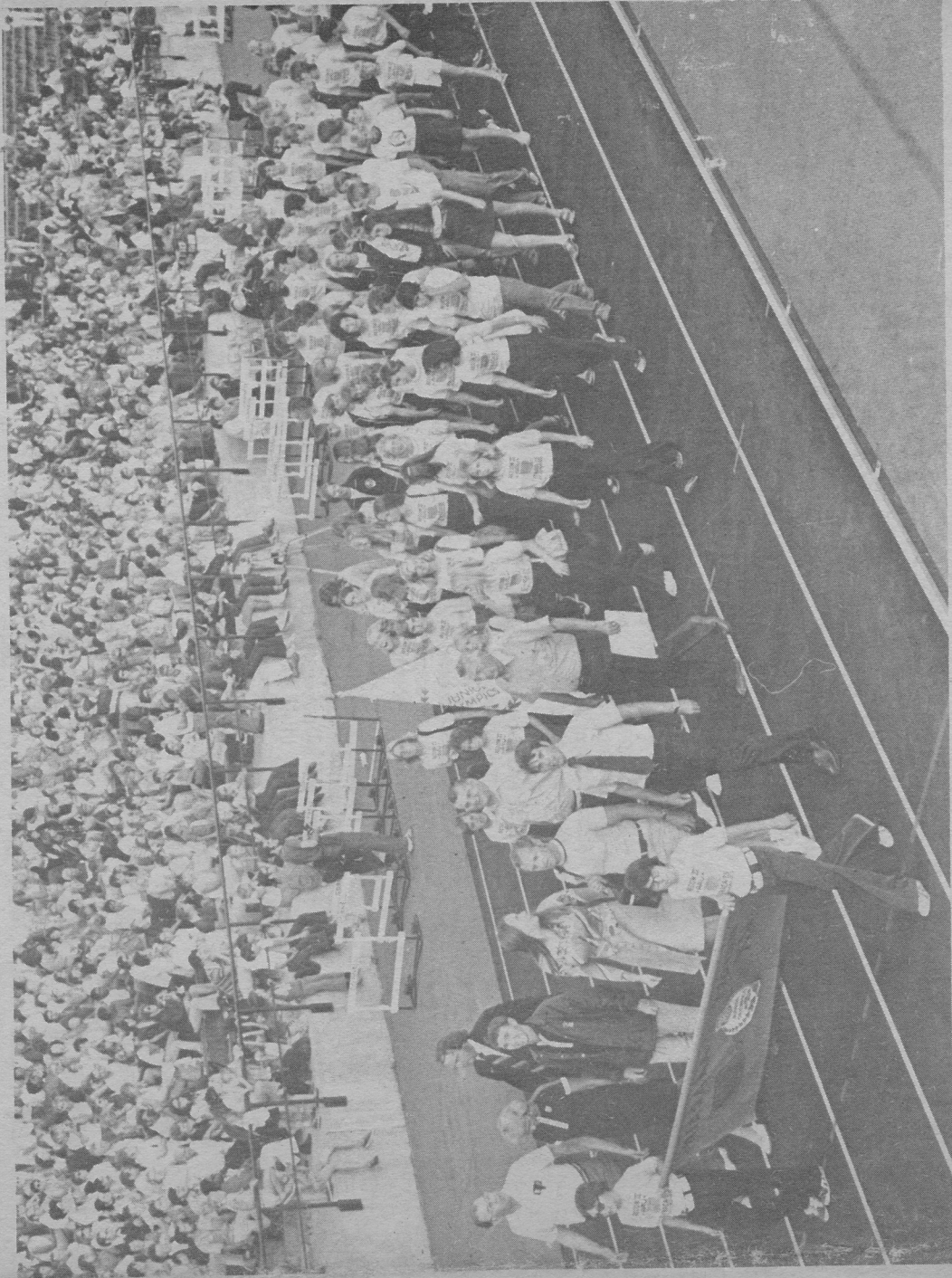
the spotlight for Monday only at I.C.

Track and field will take the spotlight at 5 p.m. today and Sunday at Schoellkopf Field. Jesse Owens, the Olympic great who took four Gold Medals at the 1936 Games in Berlin, will be present at this portion of the NJOs.

Patty Frost of Horseheads has attracted local interest in the 220 dash, where she had a qualifying time of 25.1, but she has done a 24.6 in high school competition.

Her trial will be today, with the finals scheduled for Sunday. Some of the track standouts include Bill Snoddy of North Tulsa, Okla., who has a 9.4 to his credit in the 100 dash; James Walker of Atlanta, Ga., who has a 13.9 in the 120 high hurdles, as does Jerry Hill of Indianapolis, Ind.; Jeff Lawson of Placentia Calif., and James Dixon of Richmond, Va. both have 6-11 high jumps to their credit; and Jay Reardon of Kansas City, Mo., who has a 25-1 long jump.
