The Cornell Club of Greater Buffalo has authorized me to write to you on their behalf to nominate Mr. Herbert Mols to the Cornell University Athletic Hall of Fame.

Mr. Mols earned bachelor's and master's degrees at Cornell where he participated in basketball, baseball, and football.

Mr. Mols had long been active in amateur athletics in Western New York. He was Athletic Director and coach at The Park School in Amherst. He had been Chairman of the Town of Amherst Recreation Committee and he had been Director of the Niagara District of the Amateur Athletic Union.

Mr. Mols is credited with originating the idea for the Empire Games, the New York State Olympic type competition of state athletes; he was the Western Region Director of the Games. On a national level he had been manager of United States basketball teams that participated in the Olympics and Pan-American Games.

Mr. Mols gave much of his time and talents to the development of young people. His support was broadly given as he encouraged all competitors regardless of skills. He worked to make athletic opportunity available to all.

Mr. Mols died on August 10, 1986.
